Apart from above, it is also relevant to mention here that a large number of posts are lying vacant in KVKs for a long time, which is affecting the functioning of the KVKs adversely. There is a need for filling up the vacancies on priority.

In view of above stated position, I would seek your personal intervention in these two matters to facilitate the function of KVKs in your State by extending all admissible service benefits to the staff of KVK consonant with the service benefits being availed by evenly qualified employees placed in equivalent grades of the Host Institutions, and to give necessary directions to the concerned authority to fill up all the vacancies in the KVKs expeditiously.
